




The Nursery have started a new story called The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle.

Caitlin shared her model with Mr Drake and her friends in the Nursery and was able to tell them all about it.




The Reception classes were so busy last week. They made a wonderful collaborative Jungle collage in the style of Henr Rousseau .
