

Unveiling of Beryl Gilroy Mural



Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to inform you of an exciting event that is taking place in two weeks! We will be unveiling a mural celebrating the life of Beryl Gilroy, our former headteacher, on Friday 1st July at 9am.

As I am sure you are aware, Dr Gilroy is a key figure in the history of our school and we are very proud and excited to share this wonderful piece of artwork in her honour. The mural will be on the front of the school for everyone to see.

To celebrate the revealing of the artwork, we are inviting our local community as well as representatives from the council and the Mayor's office.

This mural is the final artwork as part of 'LDN WMN', a series of free public artworks across London created by women and non-binary artists, inspired by unsung women heroes from the city's history. LDN WMN was a collaboration between City Hall and Tate Collective as part of the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan's #BehindEveryGreatCity campaign in 2018 to mark 100 years since the first women won the right to vote in the UK.

The production of this final artwork was seriously affected by the pandemic. We have been working since July 2019 to deliver this project. Unfortunately, COVID-19 interrupted the process over the past two years when we initially planned to unveil the mural back in 2020.

We are delighted to finally unveil this piece of history!

The mural has been created by the artist Fipsi Seilern. It has been painted across three panels, as the artist was keen to portray the stages of Gilroy's professional journey, using quotes from her seminal work "Black Teacher". The paintings are bordered by red, yellow and green, paying homage to Gilroy's heritage through the bright colours seen in the flag of Guyana.

We have had a sneak preview of the mural and we think it looks stunning.

Camden Science Competition

This week, ten Year 5 students were selected to present their work at the Camden Science Competition.

All the children in year 5 took part in a lesson called 'Cabbage Chemistry' in which they used red cabbage water to indicate if different substances are an acid or an alkaline.

Students who were interested in conducting further experiments were invited to take part in an additional experiment with Mr Code (Science Lead) to discover if any other fruit or vegetables can be used as an indicator. Our research showed us that while some can be used as indicators, none is as affective as red cabbage water.

The children presented their findings in front of a panel of scientists from the Crick institute and were fantastic.

Everyone nailed their lines and also presented a scientifically sound piece of work. The judges commented that we were the only school who extended our learning by taking cabbage chemistry further.

This was our first time ever entering the competition and we did not manage to win. However, next year we will be back for more!
